

2021 Social Service Report

The Township's mandated responsibility is to provide for individuals in the Township who are in need and qualify for assistance. The 2021 annual report is a summary of the assistance the Township provided through the various programs.

Assistance Provided Funded Through the General Assistance Levy

Number of Total Completed Applications Submitted

• A total of 43 completed applications were submitted to the Township requesting assistance.

General Assistance

• There were no recipients of General Assistance funds in 2021.

Emergency Assistance

• 24 households were eligible and received Emergency Assistance.

Denied Assistance

• 8 applications were denied assistance.

Applications Withdrawn

• 1 applicant withdrew their application for assistance.

SSI Recovery funds received in 2021 was 0.

Credit Counseling Workshop

Libertyville Township continues to partner with the Consumer Credit Counseling Services of Lake County to provide a monthly workshop on Basic Budgeting. All recipients of General Assistance and Emergency Assistance are required to attend one Basic Budgeting Workshop. The classes were held virtually via ZOOM.

• 17 recipients attended.

Assistance Provided Through Private Donations to the Township's Community Emergency Assistance Fund

Libertyville Township has a Community Emergency Fund funded by private tax-deductible donations to the Libertyville Township Community Emergency Fund. This fund is administered by the Township Supervisor and is used to assist those with immediate needs who may not otherwise qualify for assistance.

- 8 households who went through the application process were determined not eligible for General Assistance or Emergency Assistance but were provided help through Community Emergency Assistance Funds.
- An additional 9 households were eligible for both Emergency Assistance and Community Emergency Funds.

Food Pantry

In 2021, a total of 208 households registered to use Libertyville Township Food Pantry. Recipients can use the food pantry every week and are required to provide proof of residency.

- A total of 15 adult volunteers and a church organization with numerous volunteers assisted with Food Pantry activities. Volunteers helped unload deliveries, sorted food and packed food pantry bags each week.
- The total number of food pantry users in 2021 was 3,703 visits providing food for 7,718 individuals.
- A total of 71 Thanksgiving Dinner Boxes and 52 Christmas Dinner Boxes were donated and distributed during the holiday season.
- A total of 13 families attended our Book and Toy Fair in December to pick out donated gifts and books for their children.
- School supply packs were purchased and provided to 106 students of 45 families who have received financial assistance from the Township and/or utilized the food pantry. In addition, Sofia Coury, Gold Star Girl Scout, created 25 grade appropriate Literacy Kits that were distributed with the school supplies.
- Through our partnership with Northern Illinois Food Bank, we received 470 lbs. of Emergency Food and Shelter Program food with an estimated federal dollar value of \$389.60.
- Through Northern Illinois Food Bank's retail donation program, Direct Connect, we received
 weekly donations of such items as meat, produce, dairy, deli foods, shelf stables, non-food
 products, bread, and baked goods directly from Libertyville Jewel and bread and baked goods
 from Vernon Hills Mariano's, and a variety of products from Target in Vernon Hills.

Holiday Giving Program

- 9 sponsors provided gifts to 21 families through the Holiday Giving Program.
- Holiday Gift Room was visited by 13 families, providing gifts for 28 children.

Assistance Provided Through Community Resources

Applications for financial assistance from Share the Warmth, Salvation Army Extension Center and Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) are taken at Libertyville Township Office for eligible Libertyville Township residents. The Township Caseworker provides the application and conducts the interview for the application process. Funding is provided by the identified service provider

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

Heating Grant for low-income families, seniors, and individuals with a disability for financial assistance on their gas and electric bill.

Mother's Trust Foundation

It provides benefits and opportunities available which cannot be obtained from other sources. Their goal is to assist children in trouble or crisis, raise awareness of children's needs, link needs with community resources and provide opportunities for volunteers to be involved.

• 3 families were referred.

Salvation Army Extension Center

Libertyville Township serves as a Salvation Army Extension Center site which assists Libertyville residents with utility, rent, medicine, lodging, food needs.
